#### Principal's Update - Mr. Diaz

So many programs out there for support – food drive is one of them Grounds projects finishing up:

Other big playground is in the process to go in – lot of chaos but for good results

Water retention plan almost finished – just need mulch

Field behind the school is having resodding - incorrect grass seed used initially

Twitter feed for school is up and running

Halloween – this year – parade like in the past – Oakland Mills Symphonic band there to perform – will have a party, but due to Wellness Policy the in-class parties must be 30 minutes after last lunch, which also puts the parade much later. There will be no dances outside, just a parade.

Progress reports – emergency cards not complete – only at 38% complete World Language going well – learning objectives – monitoring progress Classroom Focus Progress – teachers meeting and discussing student progress

#### **Public Comment**

World Language- ereaders - ebooks – currently waiting for passwords to be set for all students and sent home so that families can work on language program together

Staff appreciation – given out checks for beginning of the year staff appreciation – should we give gift cards instead? – usually do cash but this year did checks instead – many teachers give money back for membership dues and can't do that with checks as easily – they are just returning checks uncashed

MAP testing – still not complete, but close (academic progress testing) – more real time results so teachers/parents get quicker results to work on PARCC testing is MSA substitute

Diaz's-Gallop poll- The surveys have not be completed yet. They should be done by Nov. Mr. Diaz did not have any update on the lower grade Gallop survey that was still being designed.

SIT meeting – Nov.  $13^{th}$  – 3:00 – 4:00 p.m. at SFES (probably in media) Process changed a bit- in the past there has been a thick set plans - now is very focused to reading benchmarks, rigor, and staff and student engagement – data type of meeting Meets 3-4 times a year

Sandra French - School budget - \$4,000 parent involvement fund
School budget- available on line
Chick-fil-A Restaurant Night – question of date – 2 different dates posted
Is there a place where we can list all the committees are with descriptions so that someone can look at 1 place and see where their interest may lie – for both school and PTA postings

Just after the meeting was adjourned, some members of the executive board discussed the possibility of buying electric pencil sharpeners for five teachers who submitted requests to the PTA.
